

Section 3 Documentation Required to qualify as a Section 3 Business

If you are requesting the Section 3 preference, you must check YES on the Section 3 Business Concern Certification form.

- 1. The contractor's firm is 51 percent or more owned by Section 3 Residents
 - Articles of Incorporation for Company
 - By-laws for Company
 - Documentation reflecting percentage of ownership for Company
 - Tax returns to show income of owner
 - Section 3 Certification for the owner (to show status)
- 2. The contractor's permanent, full-time employees include persons, at least 30 percent of whom are currently Section 3 residents, or within 3 years of the date of their first employment with the business were Section 3 residents;
 - An employee roster with ALL Full Time employees with hire date (30% of these must be Section 3 residents)
 - Section 3 Resident Certifications for the 30% of Full Time employees that are Section 3 Residents (please make sure to use the correct county form)
- 3. The Contractor hereby commits to subcontract in excess of 25 percent of the dollar amount of all subcontracts to be awarded by the business under the proposed contract to Section 3 businesses that meet the above two criteria, as identified below detailing further in the contractor's Section 3 Subcontracting Plan.
 - We will need a letter from your company stating the amount you will be subcontracting for this project. The Contractor sets the Subcontracting amount.
 - You will need to list the name of the Subcontractors and the amount you will be subcontracting to them. Example: If you wish to subcontract \$100,000 you will need to subcontract out \$25,000 to Section 3 Businesses.
 - You <u>must</u> include all of the Subcontractors Section 3 information with your bid.
